

Einstein's Mistake

There is a video short circulating on social media of Albert Einstein writing out the 9-times-table on a schoolroom chalkboard. The video shows Einstein writing 9x1, 9x2, etc. He correctly writes out the first nine results, but when it comes to 9x10, he calculates it as 91. The students all laugh and make fun of their teacher. It is not clear if Einstein made a genuine calculation mistake, or if it is simply a writing error. (It seems virtually impossible that someone of Einstein's caliber would get such an easy calculation wrong! And, as all teachers know, it is easy to make a mistake when writing vertically on a chalkboard.) Be that as it may, in the video, "Einstein" quickly recovers from the mistake and uses it to demonstrate a moral about human nature: he got 9 calculations correct and only one wrong; yet the students did not congratulate him on the 90% of correct calculations: instead, they concentrate their scorn on the one failure. Why do humans hone in on one small failure and ignore an overwhelming success? Why is bad news always more newsworthy than success stories? Food for thought....

Although most experts discount the authenticity of the Einstein narrative, the **message** of the narrative is one we would do well to take note of. In a world that is often all-too-quick to point out failures, we, Christians, have the unique privilege of being the ones who point out the good in others — the ones who rejoice in the value and successes of


