Two Leaders

The letter of 3 John contrasts the character of two church leaders: Gaius and Diotrephes. These two men exemplify the extremes of personality that, sadly, sometimes occupy the positions of church leadership: Gaius a loving and humble church leader and Diotrephes, a control-seeking domineering, and condescending leader, imbued with his own self-importance.

Gaius

Gaius appears to understand that church leadership looks a lot different from business boardroom leadership. While carrying God-given authority, church leadership is characterized more by service and prayer than by decision-making. Gaius was a true servant: given to hospitality, welcoming with open arms the traveling missionaries into his home: providing rest, refreshment and encouragement. Gaius was a man who walked in truth (v.3) and love (v.6).

Diotrephes

In human society, once one has attained a position of influence within a group, it is easy to become entrenched and imbued with one's own importance. What may have started out as an honest attempt to lead and influence for the good, becomes derailed - the leader assumes an impenetrable mantle of control, which, as the days pass, becomes inflexible. Diotrephes, perhaps because of a character flaw or simply sensing his position of leadership to be in danger (or questioned) by newcomers, refuses to welcome anyone new; he dismisses new currents of thought as automatically bad, and he even goes so far as to exclude people from the church for daring to differ from the positions adopted by him over the years. Such leaders are doomed, of course, to eventual failure as they will always, in the end, be ignored, overlooked and de-powered. But, in the meantime, they make life unpleasant, difficult and needlessly stressful while the situation plays out.
