God is My Center

Can I tell you the story of Haggai?
 This is the first of six articles
 on the Minor Prophet Book, Haggai.

Haggai's book is a story about making God "center". There are some things in it that seem odd: things about "God's house" (aka, the temple), names like Zerubbabel, or actions of God summoning a drought (we'll deal with many of these in time). Yet, as strange as some things might be, there is a worthwhile message for each of us as we strive to live with God. For his people, Haggai challenges them to examine their priorities because God is not their center. Today, his words still speak to us. We also need to examine our priorities. If we will centralize Jesus in our lives, the right priorities will come naturally, even if they might not fall into line perfectly.

The Background:

Long before Haggai, God had warned his people that idolatry and injustice would bring destruction. God was very patient, forgiving their missteps frequently. But they became so sinful that God handed them over to their enemies. One enemy, Babylon, destroyed the temple, the beloved centerpiece of the nation and "the house of God". For 70 years, Jerusalem was in ruins and the brightest and strongest citizens were slaves in Babylon.

But there was hope. Persia conquered Babylon and let many of the Jews return to their homeland to rebuild the temple. They laid the foundation, but then, sixteen years

later not a single brick had been laid. They had lost their momentum. They had lost their focus. They had lost their joy in following God. Enter Haggai.

The temple was a symbol of God being at the center of the people. It was a sign that declared, "God is with us." But because they had abandoned the work, it was as if they had pushed God to the side to focus on other commitments. Haggai's message was challenging: "Consider your ways." ~ Jason
