

### **Baobab Tree**

The Tree Itself - One of the most unusual trees in all of the world is the Baobab Tree. It is native to Africa, especially the 1000mile-long island of Madagascar, and there are some in Western Australia and the Northern Territory.



There are 8 different varieties, some growing up to 100 feet tall and with a trunk diameter of up to 50 feet. The most wellknown is the Madagascan "Upside-Down Tree" - so called because the branches look just like a root system, as if the tree was standing on its head. The native name is 'Renala' which means 'Mother of the Forest', a really apt name because baobabs support human and animal life to an extraordinary degree: providing essential resources for people, animals and the ecosystem in general; sometimes even being used as a burial site, sustaining life, and also cradling it at the end.

The fruit (known as Monkey Bread) is a rich source of nutrients, including vitamin C; the leaves, rich in protein, calcium and iron, are eaten as a vegetable and powdered for soups and sauces, and are also used as a medicine. The tree can store thousands of gallons of water in its trunk and is vital for life during droughts; the massive hollow trunk can be used as a shelter or a storehouse. There are examples of families actually living inside a tree, and of the police employing the space as a makeshift prison: the bark can be stripped and woven into ropes, mats and baskets, even clothing - this use does not kill the tree as it regenerates over time. Finally, birds, bats and insects all use the baobab as a home and elephants have learned to strip the bark for moisture during the dry season.

The Tree of Life – The Baobab Tree is sometimes called the "Tree of Life" due to its ability to completely sustain the family living in or near it. This name reminds us of the life-sustaining tree in the Garden of Eden with the same name. From that tree, Adam and Eve ate the life-nourishing fruit that appears

to have preserved them from death – until they were removed from the Garden. The Tree of Life is mentioned again in Revelation 22:2, located in heaven, sustained by the River of Life. These images remind us that, in heaven, things will be different, better, eternal, God will provide all. All will be well. ~ Stephen
