

When We All Get to Heaven

Eliza Edmunds Hewitt, sometimes known as Lidie H Edmunds, was a brilliant person. She was born in 1851 in Philadelphia and lived there all her life. She studied at the University of Pennsylvania and was valedictorian of her class. She taught at the Northern Home for Friendless Children, but when she was in her 30s, she was struck on the back with a heavy slate by a student who she had disciplined. The spinal injury that ensued put her in a plaster cast for a very long time: she only partially recovered. This event brought about a profound change in her life: she studied English literature and, in an effort, to make sense of what had happened, she began writing poems for the primary department of her local church. She was very prolific, and a look at the titles of her most well-known poems reveals that the name of Jesus, the words Heaven, Soul, sunshine and light are the themes of all of them. The terrible accident she suffered refocused her life on Jesus, and the light and freedom He brings; and she shared this message in countless poems and hymn lyrics.

Her beautiful hymn "When We All Get to Heaven" has encouraged Christians for generations with its triumphant melody and reassuring message. Life is often filled with struggles that overwhelm and appear insurmountable. They bog us down, depress our spirits and distract us from our focus on Christ. These struggles sometimes linger. They last for weeks, months or years – darkening our path and making us discouraged. Clouds overspread the sky. And yet, this

hymn directs our attention to that moment, when, "just one glimpse of Him in glory will the toils of life repay." The moment that we see Jesus, the toils and struggles of life will become a distant memory. They will pale in comparison to the moment of being in the presence of the glorified Jesus.
