
Send Someone Else

"Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, 'Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?' And I said, 'Here am I. Send me!'" (Isaiah 6:8).

The book of Isaiah opens with a dramatic heavenly scene in which Isaiah is confronted with a vision of God. Sixwinged seraphs are flying over God's throne; and I like to think that the wings covering the seraphs' eves shows us that God is too awesome, too wonderful, too resplendent for human eyes to be able to see; two wings are covering their feet, for our feet must always walk in the ways of God, not any path of our human choosing; and two wings are used for flying: we must use the gifts God gives us to do his will. When confronted with this scene of magnificent glory, Isaiah is immediately filled with a deep sense of his own unworthiness. But God allows his lips to be touched with the forgiving touch of an altar's burning coal, just as later God sends Jesus to be a similar cleansing fire for all of humanity. And so, Isaiah can now, indeed must now offer himself to God: "I will go for you, send me." This must also be our response when God asks if we will be his messenger.

In considering the great invitation given to Isaiah and his beautifully accepting response, it reminds us of the great invitation given to us. As with any invitation, there is always the tendency to reply, "Please send someone else." Years ago, the Acappella company produced a song with the lyrics, "Everybody said that anybody could do all the good things that nobody did." The message is clear:
