

True Repentance "Here and now I give half of my possessions to the poor" (Luke 19:8).

Chief Tax Collector

The Romans employed a local person to be the receiving officer of his district's taxes. The advantages for the Roman machine were obvious : a local would know all the inhabitants probably by name, or at least by sight; and there was no problem of language. So the tax collector was arguably the least liked person in the community - he was seen as a traitor, and often overcharged the population, thus lining his own pocket. The Romans turned a blind eye to this frequent overcharging, of course - it was a small price to pay to collect the tax money efficiently. We remember that the apostle Matthew had also been a tax collector (publican), making him suspicious to the other apostles when he joined the group. Now, Zacchaeus was the chief tax collector, so we may imagine that he was trusted by the Romans and had served them for a time. We can also imagine that his elevated position made him even less popular with his neighbors. Jesus, the master discerner, saw through to Zacchaeus' heart, and chose him as his host for the evening, thus breaking the mold of hate that surrounded him, and paving the way for good to come from evil. We are taught the beautiful lesson that it's never too late to repent and to realize the good within, even if it has been buried for a long time.

Overcoming obstacles

There are many reasons why Zacchaeus might have given up on his quest to see Jesus. The most obvious barrier is his height. As a short man, and because of the crowd, Zacchaeus may have thought it was pointless to try to see Jesus. Other barriers include the indignity of climbing a tree, and the social rejection and ire felt by the people around him. It must certainly have been humbling and surprising when Jesus turned his attention to the tree and to the man who had climbed it. We learn that no one, despite his reputation, is outside of the interested gaze of Jesus. Zacchaeus may have thought that he went to town to find Jesus. The truth may be that Jesus went to Jericho to find Zacchaeus (Luke 19:10).

Actions of Repentance

Zacchaeus' actions of repentance are shocking and unexpected. The Old Testament generally required a double payment as restitution for theft. For some thefts, paying back four or five times was required. That Zacchaeus would offer to pay back four times what he had "cheated" anyone shows the depth of his repentance - and this is after and on top of an offer to give half of all of his possessions to the poor.

We learn from the repentance of Zacchaeus to never underestimate the impact that meeting Jesus will have on a person's life. Often the most unlikely become the most likely when face to face with Jesus.


