

### The Burning House

Many human-interest stories have emerged from the ashes of the Los Angeles fires. One that caught my eye was of a 90year-old woman detailing the escape from her burning neighborhood. Her voice was calm. Her eyes, reflective. And, whereas her devastation touched me deeply, it was her perspective on her loss that impressed me. I marked her words in my mind as worthy of remembrance.

The ways of God are not always evident to us, as discussed in last week's sermon, when I said that it may only be when we look over our shoulder that we begin to glimpse the good things that can come out of disaster. The grandmother in the news video is a clear case in point. At the age of nearly 90 she had accumulated in the house that she lost, 48 years of stuff - sets of crockery, closets full of clothes, four sets of dishes. Most of us are like this - collecting things as life goes along, through Christmases and birthdays, wedding anniversaries and other of life's milestones. However, the lesson from our grandmother is that only the things you can't buy are of lasting importance: human love and the people around each one of us. We don't need innumerable possessions to let us live a happy life. In fact, often these things get in the way, become too important. A happy life comes from our faith, and the love we share with our families and friends.

For Christians, this love is one of the manifestations of the love that Christ bore for us all, and is summed up by Christ's answer to the question "What is the greatest commandment?" "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' On these two commandments depend all the Law and the Prophets." — Matthew 22:37–40 (ESV)
